Our services include assisting with resume writing, coaching through the interview process, connecting job seekers to employers and more.

IdahoWorks: Create a profile and search thousands of job openings by city, county or occupation. Upload a resume for employers to view, connect with a workforce consultant and find training programs to start a new career.

Jobscape: This career search tool helps job seekers, students and veterans make wise career choices by teaching them about wages, jobs in demand and available training programs.

Adult and youth: Adults and youth forge their own path with support from Idaho Labor. Earn a GED, access training resources and learn more about our tutoring and education resources.

Unemployment services: File for unemployment benefits, manage your claim online, and learn about your rights and responsibilities as a job seeker.

Apprenticeships: As a registered apprentice, you'll start work right away while gaining practical experience on the job. Nearly 1,900 Idahoans are enrolled in a Registered Apprenticeship program.

Veteran services: Our services for qualified veterans include training programs, Veterans Readiness and Employment classes, GI Bill information and the Homeless Veterans Reintegration program. Idaho veteran representatives are available for assistance throughout the state.
