Lewiston City Council Member Appointed to Governor's Serve Idaho Commission

Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter has appointed Jesse Maldonado of Lewiston as a member of Serve Idaho, the Governor's Commission on Service and Volunteerism.

"Our commissioners bring a wealth of knowledge and energy to the commission as well as first-hand knowledge of the benefits and rewards of service in our communities," said Renee Bade, program manager for Serve Idaho.

Idaho currently ranks second nationally for volunteerism with more than 422,000 people volunteering their time.

Maldonado was elected to the Lewiston City Council in 2013 at age 18. He attends Lewis-Clark State College (LCSC) where he is pursuing a degree in business and communications. In addition to his duties on the city council, Maldonado is a member of the Idaho Hall of Fame Selection Committee and the LCSC chapter of the National Society of Leadership and Success. He has also served on the Youth Advisory Commission, Lewiston City Library Board of Trustees and Visit Lewis Clark Valley.
