Lewiston Residents Elected to Lead Governor's Serve Idaho Commission

Charlette Kremer and Jesse Maldonado, both of Lewiston, were elected to serve as the 2017 chair and vice chair of Serve Idaho, the Governor's Commission on Service and Volunteerism. Both Kremer and Maldonado have served on the commission since 2014.

Chair Kremer is a longtime supporter of volunteerism and national service in Idaho, formerly serving as the program director for Lewis-Clark Service Corps. Before that she served two years as an AmeriCorps VISTA (Volunteer in Service to America) with Lewis-Clark State College. She is currently the director of grants and contracts for Lewis-Clark State College and serves as chair of the board of the Second Judicial District Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA).

Vice Chair Maldonado is a student at Lewis-Clark State College. He is currently a Lewiston City Council member and serves as the vice chair for the Idaho State Democratic Party.

"Both Ms. Kremer and Mr. Maldonado bring an enthusiasm for service that is second to none," said Program Manager Renee Bade. "We are extremely fortunate to have both of them serve as leaders of the commission this year."
