These training programs are open to qualified veterans where funding is available.

- **Veterans Readiness and Employment (VR&E)** – training services for veterans with service-related disabilities
- **GI Bill** – education, apprenticeships and on-the-job training programs for qualified veteran

Other important information

Improve your job search with these services.

- **Workshops** – dealing with changes and transitions, marketing yourself to employers, assessing personal skills, tapping into the hidden job market, writing effective resumes and interviewing with confidence.
- **Reemployment rights** – your reserve status is protected against discrimination. Find out more about returning to a former employer.
- **General information** – information on community resources such as food, housing, medical and transportation assistance.
- **Unemployment insurance** – temporary income for unemployed workers who qualify.
- **Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC)** – tax benefits for employers who hire veterans like you.
