

Veterans' Priority of Service

For veterans and eligible spouses.

To show our appreciation for your service, please let us serve you first.

Priority of service

Provides veterans and eligible spouses priority access in the Idaho Department of Labor offices to any program or service for workforce preparation, development or training to include (but not limited to) the following:

Programs

- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act
- Wagner-Peyser Act (employment services)
- Trade Adjustment Assistance
- Any other current or future job training program

Services

- New job postings
- Resume assistance
- Interview techniques
- Access to computers, copiers, telephones, faxes

Veteran and eligible spouse is defined as

Veteran – a person who served in active military, naval or air service, and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

Eligible spouse – a person who is the spouse of any of the following:

- A veteran who died of a service-connected disability.
- A veteran who has a total disability resulting from a service-connected disability, as evaluated by the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- A veteran who died while a disability, as evaluated by the Department of Veterans Affairs, was in existence.
- A member of the Armed Forces serving on active duty who, at the time of the application for priority, is listed in one or more of the following categories and has been listed for more than 90 days:
 - Missing in action.
 - Captured in the line of duty by a hostile force.
 - Forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by a foreign government or power.

Identify yourself as a veteran or an eligible spouse of a veteran at the Idaho Department of Labor to receive priority service.
