Steps to build your workforce through a School to Registered Apprenticeship Program (STRAP)

1 Develop

Design and federally register your apprenticeship program with the support of Apprenticeship Idaho.

2 Collaborate

Work together with Apprenticeship Idaho and schools to identify apprenticeship opportunities and partners.

3 Prepare

Work with schools, parents and students to prepare students for upcoming apprenticeship opportunities.

4 Recruit

Build a Talent Recruitment Plan and coordinate apprenticeship recruitment efforts with schools.

5 Hire

Coordinate with schools, students and parents on applications and interviews. Choose students for apprenticeships and sign STRAP agreements.

6 Train

Begin on-the-job training for students while they continue related training.

7 Graduate

See students through high school graduation and partial apprenticeship program completion. Continue student employment in the apprenticeship program with an advancing wage scale.

8 Certification

Advance apprentices to a journey worker pay scale as they complete the program and earn a national credential.
